# Quality Learning

#### **Quality Learning Environments**

#### **Outcomes:**

• Positive Mental Health - Character Education

## How is HPE achieving this outcome?

- Kindness Counts Promoting acts of kindness
  - Students are encouraged to demonstrate kind behaviours such as showing empathy, helping peers or contributing positively to the school environment. Student kindness slips are read on the announcements, displayed in the hallway and two students are selected each month to win the kindness prize.
- In collaboration with our staff, school council and students HPE selected 10 virtues to focus on throughout the school year. The 7 Grandfather Teachings plus giving, sportsmanship and leaps and bounds (growth mindset). Each month each class selects a student that exemplifies the month's virtue to be recognized at our assembly.
- This year HPE has developed a Student Leadership group, these students have taken on a leadership role in planning positive and collaborative events for our school.
- At HPE we use restorative practices to resolve conflicts in a way that strengthens
  relationships rather than punishing individuals. Students involved in conflicts participate in
  guided discussion to understand the impact of their actions and find ways to repair
  relationships.
  - Students learn to take responsibility for their actions and consider who their behaviour affects others. This helps develop empathy, self-awareness and a sense of fairness.
- Teachers incorporate lessons on kindness, empathy and conflict resolution into fairly activities, often tying these themes to literacy and social studies.
- In collaboration with EWP, HPE has created a mentorship program where EWP students lead and support HPE students through various character building activities designed to support the development of skills like resilience.
- Students engage in acts of kindness that extend beyond the school, such as writing thank you notes for community workers or participating in service projects (e.g. community clean up) emphasizing the broader impact of positive change.
- Staff model kindness, empathy and restorative behaviour sin their interactions with students and each other.
  - In collaboration with the RCMP each year two students in grade 6 are presented with an RCMP Challenge Coin. These students are strong positive role models in our school and broader community.
