Some of our staff and students are allergic to perfume. Please avoid wearing scents at school.







How is HPE achieving this outcome?

Indigenous Education Programming

- This year HPE is looking for a new Indigenous Education Coach, we will be supported by coaches from across the division until the position is filled.
- Our monthly student awards are based on the 7 Grandfather Teachings.
- Each year HPE recognizes Orange Shirt Day and National Truth and Reconciliation Day in September and MMIWG in May.
- Last year we had several land-based learning experiences including
 - Skinning Presentation
 - Teepee Teachings
 - Smudging protocols
- Spruce Tip Harvesting
- Birch Bark Harvesting
- Mock Trapline
- Fishing Demonstration
- In June we will be celebrating Indigenous Peoples Day with a variety of activities provided by knowledge keepers and elders.

Parental/Community Engagement

- School Council is held monthly with both in person and online options.
- We encourage families attend our monthly assemblies held near the end of each month.
- We have adjusted and extended our Parent/Teacher Interview times to allow for more conversation and to accommodate different working hours.
- We hold several events such as Open House, Block Party and concerts throughout the year.
- We love having family and community volunteers, our Book Fair is run completely by volunteers.
- We partner with EWP and PRS to support mentorship programs for students interested in future careers in education, early years and food services.
- HPE participates in community events such as the Heart River Housing Block Party
- We connect with various organizations such as the High Prairie Beautification Association and Pleasant View Lodge to allow students to learn from community members.
- We have worked with both the RCMP and the Fire Department in running joint safety drills to ensure that all community agencies are familiar with procedures in the event of a true emergency.
- HPSD continues to hold parent focus groups and information sessions to learn more from our parents and community.
